A 5.2-magnitude earthquake struck southern Turkey on Monday, killing at least one person and trapping others in collapsed buildings three weeks after a **36** 7.8-magnitude quake struck the same region, leaving more than 50,000 people dead in the country and in neighboring Syria. The emergency agency urged people in the affected region not to enter damaged buildings to collect belongings for fear of **37** or further collapse. Rescuers were also searching for survivors from collapsed buildings. In Turkey, the quake has led to intense **38** of building practices and of the government checks put in place to make sure that buildings can **39** shaking. Turkish authorities have expanded a criminal probe into individuals responsible for buildings **40** by the deadly earthquake that has left millions without homes. The government has also been accused of lax safety enforcement ahead of the quakes.
